## 'Be Internet Citizens': empowering young minds at Beal

On Friday 10th October 2025, Beal High School proudly hosted an exciting event that brought together students, teachers and digital experts for a morning of inspiration and learning. 'The 'Be Internet Citizens' workshop, delivered in partnership with ParentZone, YouTube, and our local MP Wes Streeting, aimed to equip secondary school students with the tools to navigate the digital world safely and responsibly, tackling the spread of misinformation and disinformation online. 60 students from years 9, 10 and 11 gathered in the new Maths school block to take part in interactive sessions focused on spotting misinformation, understanding online influence, and building positive digital communities. The energy in the 'Hawkins' room was electric as students engaged with trainers, asked insightful questions, and collaborated on activities designed to sharpen their critical thinking and media literacy. Local MP Wes Streeting then spoke to the students about how misinformation online can be a threat to our local and national democracy, and the importance of checking sources and establishing objective truth. Next up for the students involved is to lead a series of whole school assemblies to raise awareness of safety online so all students at the school benefit from the visit. Well done to all of the year 9, 10 and 11 students involved and thanks to staff too for supporting the event.







'Last Friday, I was fortunate enough to attend the Internet citizen workshop, in collaboration with YouTube. They taught the difference between Misinformation (when something is shared by mistake) and Disinformation (something shared on purpose to harm others), as well as some of the dangers of AI and how it could trick people into believing wrong things. We were also told to always hit pause, think and research when we are unsure about information being given on social media and the news. The local MP also came along to tell us about his experience with misinformation and disinformation, proving that even experienced politicians make the same mistakes as us. #### **Beal Student Forum Visits the Heart of British Democracy**

On Monday 20th October, students from Year 7 to Year 13 in the Beal Student Forum embarked on an inspiring visit to the Houses of Parliament in Westminster — the historic centre of UK democracy and legislation.

The day began with a guided tour through Westminster Hall, the oldest part of the Parliamentary estate, followed by visits to both the House of Commons and the House of Lords. Students had the rare opportunity to witness live debates on women's health and post-16 education outcomes for disadvantaged students, led by the current Secretary of State for Education, Bridget Phillipson.

After the tour, students participated in an interactive workshop where they learned how to start their own petition — a powerful tool for civic engagement. The afternoon concluded with a memorable meeting with local MP Wes Streeting, who shared insights into life as a politician and encouraged students to "dream big and never let anyone tell you what you can't achieve."

- ★ Highlights of the visit included:
- Seeing the iconic solid gold chair in the House of Lords- where only the King may sit
- Learning about "parliamentary ping-pong" the back-and-forth process of scrutinising and amending legislation between both Houses
- Standing in the same spot where Nelson Mandela, Barack Obama, and Volodymyr Zelenskyy delivered historic speeches
- Discovering the statue damaged during a suffragette protest, where a campaigner chained herself for six hours

Reflecting on the significance of the 1000-year-old Westminster Hall, where Queen Elizabeth II lay in state Student reflections:

- Amira shared, "My favourite part was hearing from our local MP. His words really stuck with me about dreaming big and never letting anyone putting a limit on what you can achieve with hard work and resilience."
- Harkirat called it a "brilliant day out" and urged other students to visit if they get the chance.
- Kirsty said the experience made her consider a future career in Westminster.
- The visit was not only educational but deeply inspiring, offering students a firsthand look at how democracy works and how their voices can shape the future.












Year 8 have settled well into the Autumn Term, already accruing large amounts of achievement points:






# **Year 9 News**
